
WHEREAS: they place similar values on the vibrancy of their cities with an international perspective on citizen participation; and

WHEREAS: they place similar values on cultural understanding, training, development of youth, and exchanges to educate citizens; and


WHEREAS: they are committed to collaboration that promotes and broadens mutual knowledge and best practices across a variety of sectors and constituencies; and


